BACKGROUND

TASEZ Zone Operations is committed to providing TASEZ tenants with world class facilities that meet health and safety regulations. In accordance with TASEZ's maintenance strategy, the TASEZ facilities must be maintained to the best standard possible, meet statutory obligations and the operational needs of the investor community.

An inspection service provider shall complete a comprehensive report for each lift, escalator, or passenger conveyor inspected and tested. The service provider must date and sign each report and submit it to the user within 30 days. The user is required to keep the original report in a safe place and ensure that a copy is placed in the machine compartment.

- 3.1.4. The approved Inspection Authority (AIA) will inspect and test the lifts in accordance with the relevant health and safety standard incorporated into the regulations under section 44 of the Occupational Health and Safety act ,1993.
- 3.1.5. If an inspection or test carried out by an Approved Inspection Authority shows that any defect or weakness exists whereby persons are endangered, the inspection services provider shall report such defect or weakness forthwith to the TASEZ, the competent Lift Maintenance Service Provider and the provincial director, and refrain prevent the lift from being operated until such defect has been rectified to the satisfaction of the inspection service provider.
- 3.1.6. The AIA will undertake inspection and testing of the lifts and lifting equipment listed in paragraph 3.1.2 and 3.1.3
 - 3.1.6.1. After any failure has occurred; or
 - 3.1.6.2. whenever there has been a change in the competent lift service provider; and
 - 3.1.6.3. Every 24 months

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3.2. Pricing Schedule

3.2.1. The Bidder shall submit the Pricing Schedule as part of the Returnable Schedules.

3.2.2. The Bidder shall submit a cost structure in which milestones are clearly defined and priced accordingly.

4. CONTACT AND COMMUNICATION

- 4.1. All communication and enquiries shall be **in writing** (via email), to the following email address, <u>rfqs-rfps@tasez.co.za</u>. TASEZ will communicate with all Bidders where clarity regarding this RFQ is sought.
- 4.2. Clarification questions from bidders will be closed two (2) days before date of closure on the RFQ.
- 4.3. Any communication to an official in respect of the RFQ between the closing date and the award of the contract by the Bidders is prohibited.
- 4.4. If a Bidders finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ (other than minor clerical matters), the Bidders must promptly notify TASEZ in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford TASEZ an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- 4.5. Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error, or inconsistency in the RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all Bidders without attribution to the Bidders who provided the written notice.
- 4.6. All people (including Bidders) obtaining or receiving the RFQ and any other information in connection with the RFQ must keep the contents of the RFQ and other such information confidential and not disclose or use the information except as required for the purpose of developing a response to the RFQ.

5. LATE SUBMISSION

- 5.1. Late responses to the RFQ will not be accepted.
- 5.2. All dates and times in this RFQs are in accordance to the South African standard calendar and time.

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5.3. Any time or date in this RFQ is subject to change at TASEZ's discretion. The establishment of a time or date in this RFQ does not create an obligation on the part of TASEZ to take any action or create any right in any way for any Bidders to demand that any action be taken on the date established.

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5.4. The Bidders accepts that, if TASEZ extends the deadline for the RFQ submission (the closing date) for any reason, the requirements of this RFQ otherwise apply equally to the extended deadline

2. Definitions

- 2.2. "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3. "Bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;

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2.4. "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

- 2.5. "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.6. "functionality" means the ability of a Bidder to provide goods or services in accordance with specifications as set out in the tender documents.
- 2.7. "Prices" includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;

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This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a declaration form for local content (local production and local content are used interchangeably).
