BACKGROUND

hoc basis

The Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ) is co-owned by the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (the DTIC), the Gautena Provincial Government (GPG) and the City of Tshwane Municipality (CoT).

TASEZ is registered in terms of the Companies Act No 71 of 2008 and it is the Operator of the Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone in terms of the Special Economic Zones Act 16 of 2014. TASEZ is situated in the east of Pretoria City in Silverton. It aims to offer a diversity of appropriate land uses and other economic activities.

Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ) owns significant investment property, which includes bulk infrastructure such as water systems, roads, and electricity, as well as several buildings. As part of our compliance with the GRAP (Generally Recognized Accounting Practice) standards, it is necessary to maintain a comprehensive and accurate fixed asset register for these investment properties.

The existing register requires updates to reflect physical verifications, asset condition assessments, and compliance with GRAP standards, including componentisation and calculation of depreciation. The procurement of a qualified professional service provider is essential to ensure that the fixed asset register is fully compliant with GRAP and meets audit requirements. This will enhance financial transparency, facilitate future audits, and ensure the integrity of our financial records regarding investment property.

2. INIVITATION TO SUBMIT A QUOTATION

Appointment of a Service Provider for the Preparation of a GRAP compliant fixed asset register to Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone for a period of twelve months on ad hoc basis.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

3.1. General Requirements

3.1.1. TASEZ seeks to appoint a suitable and qualified professional service provider to prepare a GRAP compliant fixed assets register for the investment properties at the zone. The scope of the services required from the professional service provider shall include:

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3.1.1.1. Physical Verification of Assets

3.1.1.1.1. Conduct physical inspections of all investment property assets, including bulk infrastructure (water, roads, electricity) and buildings.

3.1.1.2. Condition Assessment

3.1.1.2.1. Assess and document the current condition of all investment properties to determine the useful life and depreciation rates.

3.1.1.3. Preparation of GRAP-Compliant Fixed Asset Register

3.1.1.3.1. Compile a fixed asset register that is fully compliant with GRAP standards for investment property, including detailed asset descriptions, classifications, and relevant financial data.

3.1.1.4. Componentisation

3.1.1.4.1. Perform componentisation to break down complex assets into their significant components for better accuracy in asset management and depreciation calculation.

3.1.1.5. Depreciation Calculations

3.1.1.5.1. Accurately calculate depreciation for all components of the investment property, adhering to GRAP standards.

3.1.1.6. Transfer of skills

3.1.1.6.1. Provide training technical and on the job training to finance and infrastructure team on verification and the componentisation of infrastructure assets.

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3.1.1.7. Audit Support

3.1.1.7.1. Provide support for audit purposes, ensuring all data in the fixed asset register is audit-ready and compliant with regulatory and reporting standards.

- 3.1.1.7.2. Assist with submission of request for information
- 3.1.1.7.3. Assist with responses to audit findings.

4. CONTACT AND COMMUNICATION

- **4.1.** All communication and enquiries shall be <u>in writing</u> (via email), to the following email address, <u>rfqs-rfps@tasez.co.za</u>. TASEZ will communicate with all Bidders where clarity regarding this RFQ is sought.
- 4.2. Clarification questions from bidders will be closed one (1) day before date of closure on the RFQ.
- **4.3.** Any communication to an official in respect of the RFQ between the closing date and the award of the contract by the Bidders is prohibited.
- **4.4.** If a Bidders finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ (other than minor clerical matters), the Bidders must promptly notify TASEZ in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford TASEZ an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- **4.5.** Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error, or inconsistency in the RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all Bidders without attribution to the Bidders who provided the written notice.
- **4.6.** All persons (including Bidders) obtaining or receiving the RFQ and any other information in connection with the RFQ must keep the contents of the RFQ and other such information confidential and not disclose or use the information except as required for the purpose of developing a response to the RFQ.

5. LATE SUBMISSION

- **5.1.** Late responses to the RFQ will not be accepted.
- 5.2. All dates and times in this RFQs are in accordance to the South African standard calendar and time.

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5.3. Any time or date in this RFQ is subject to change at TASEZ's discretion. The establishment of a time or date in this RFQ does not create an obligation on the part of TASEZ to take any action or create any right in any way for any Bidders to demand that any action be taken on the date established.

5.4. The Bidders accepts that, if TASEZ extends the deadline for the RFQ submission (the closing date) for any reason, the requirements of this RFQ otherwise apply equally to the extended deadline

- 2.3. "Bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.4. "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
